Verse(s)	Main point(s)
Exodus 19 v 3 to 6	The Israelites are promised that they will be precious to God if they obey Him.
Deuteronomy 11 v 26 to 28	God spells out to the Israelites the consequences of obeying or disobeying.
Isaiah 66 v 2	God looks favourably on those who respect and obey his word.
Luke 6 v 47 and 48	Those who obey Jesus are like a house with solid foundations.
Luke 8 v 21	Jesus regards those who obey God as his family.
Acts 4 v 19, 5 v 29	The apostle Peter on two occasions is clear whom to obey when there is a conflict between obeying God or men.
