9 to 11	<p>9 Much more then, being now justified* by his blood, we will be saved from God's wrath through him. 10 For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled** to God through the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we will be saved by his life. 11 Not only so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation.</p> <p><i>* Justified means made right (with God)</i></p> <p><i>** reconcile means to restore a broken relationship (between God and us)</i></p>	How are we now justified and what do we gain?
12	<p>12 Therefore, as sin entered into the world through one man, and death through sin, so death passed to all men because all sinned.</p>	How has death passed to us all?
13 and 14	<p>13 For until the law, sin was in the world; but sin is not charged when there is no law. 14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those whose sins weren't like Adam's disobedience, who is a foreshadowing of him who was to come.</p>	What happened from Adam to Moses?
15 to 17	<p>15 But the free gift isn't like the trespass. For if by the trespass of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many. 16 The gift is not as through one who sinned; for the judgement came by one to condemnation, but the free gift followed many trespasses to justification. 17 For if by the trespass of the one, death reigned through the one; so much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one, Jesus Christ.</p>	How is the free gift different from the trespass?



18 and 19	18 So then as through one trespass, all men were condemned; even so through one act of righteousness, all men were justified to life. 19 For as through the one man's disobedience many were made sinners, even so through the obedience of the one, many will be made righteous. 20 and 21	20 The law came in that the trespass might abound; but where sin abounded, grace abounded more exceedingly, 21 that as sin reigned in death, even so grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.	What is achieved by grace?
