



This plan will help you read one Bible chapter a day and help you understand the chapter. There is a brief introduction to the chapter followed by three questions. You will find the answers in the chapter. Read the chapter through before you try to answer the questions.

**Day 1**

<b>Psalm 72</b>	
	In different hands, our world would be a much better place to live in. In this Psalm we meet a special person sent by God to change our world. The Psalm describes this person in his role as a compassionate world leader. It shows what moral, social and political changes he will bring about. This special person is the Lord Jesus Christ.
1.	What will this king do for the needy?
2.	How will the nations react to him?
3.	How will this king treat those suffering oppression and violence?

**Day 2**

<b>Isaiah 11</b>	
	Better judgements would improve our world. In this Psalm we are given more information about the special person sent by our caring God. He will have the God-given wisdom and power to judge and rule our world wisely. The first verse tells us that this special person is a descendant of Jesse who was the father of king David.
1.	What characteristics will this person have as a result of God's spirit upon him?
2.	In what two ways will the special person not judge us?
3.	How extensive will the knowledge of the LORD be?

**Day 3**

<b>Acts 17</b>	
	The apostle Paul tells his hearers in Athens about Jesus Christ. He is the special person promised in the Old Testament whom God raised from the dead. The resurrection of Jesus is God's guarantee that he will send him to judge the world. Paul encourages the Athenians to get to know the God of creation and become involved in his plan.
1.	What is the name of the special person who Paul says is the "the Christ"?
2.	What was notable about how the Bereans read the Scriptures?
3.	What idea caused the men of Athens to mock Paul?



Day 4

1 Corinthians 15	
	Death need not be the end. The apostle Paul says that our caring God can raise us from the dead. He explains that Jesus' resurrection shows that we also can be raised. The death and resurrection of Christ were foretold in the Old Testament Scriptures. Those in Christ will be raised from the dead at his coming.
1.	What three things does Paul want them to know happened to Christ?
2.	What are the first three consequences that Paul says there are if there is no resurrection?
3.	What is the last enemy that Christ will destroy?

Day 5

Psalm 19	
	This Psalm of David starts by seeing what we learn about God by looking at the universe. Creation indicates the power and glory of God. The Psalm then considers the more valuable message from God in the Bible. Only the Bible tells us about God's character and his plan for our world.
1.	What does the sky show us?
2.	What six things are better than honey and gold?
3.	What two things does David want to be acceptable to the LORD?

Day 6

1 Corinthians 13	
	Believers are encouraged to show love. This reflects the character of the loving God of the Bible. Love is the best quality we can show in our lives.
1.	What things are useless, if we don't have love?
2.	What sort of behaviour indicates that we are showing love to others?
3.	What sort of behaviour do we avoid if we show love in our lives?



Day 7

2 Timothy 3	
	How we react to God's message in the Bible greatly affects our lives. We are warned what will happen if God's message is ignored. We can see this in our world today. By contrast we can have the hope of a long-term future. This is through belief in God's plan with his special person - Jesus Christ. The Bible message is given by God to make us godly and lead us to salvation.
1.	What does Paul say people will love in the last days, instead of God?
2.	What does Paul say that those who live a godly life, should expect?
3.	What kind of wisdom is the Bible able to give you?
