Mark 16	
	Jesus is raised from the dead and is seen by his followers. He gives final instructions. He then goes from them, into heaven.
1.	When did the women come to the tomb?
2.	Who was the first disciple to meet the risen Jesus?
3.	How many times, according to Mark, did Jesus appear and talk to the disciples after he was raised?

Day 2

Acts 1	
	Before ascending into heaven, Jesus promises his followers that he will come back. He also promises special powers to help them witness for him.
1.	What did Jesus spend forty days teaching the disciples about?
2.	What promise did the angels give the disciples, when Jesus went to heaven?
3.	What were the necessary qualifications for a disciple to replace Judas as one of the twelve?

Day 3

Acts 2	
	Peter gives his message in the temple after the apostles have received the Holy Spirit. Having denied Jesus three times, he now witnesses fearlessly in Jerusalem. He tells his hearers that repentance, belief and baptism are all essential.
1.	After receiving the Holy Spirit, the apostles went out to speak to the people. Why were the people surprised by what they heard?
2.	When Peter told them that they had crucified the "Christ", the people asked what they should do. What was Peter's reply?
3.	What did those "who gladly received his word (and) were baptised" do afterwards?



Day 4

Acts 3	
	Peter heals a lame man at the Beautiful Gate of the temple giving evidence that his message is from God. Peter tells his hearers that Jesus will return. This was foretold by the prophets.
1.	Verse 1 tells us that the ninth hour was the hour of prayer. As the Jews counted hours from 6am, what time would this be on our clocks?
2.	What was it that God announced by the mouth of all his prophets?
3.	What was the covenant God made with the fathers?

Day 5

Acts 4	
	Peter appeals to the Jews to believe in Jesus Christ after healing a lame man through faith in Jesus Christ. He tells them that only Christ and his teaching can offer salvation.
1.	What part of the apostles' teaching were the religious leaders particularly upset about?
2.	In whose name did Peter say the man was able to stand?
3.	What is it that only Jesus can do for us?

Day 6

Acts 5	
	Ananias dies trying to deceive the apostles. Peter continues to witness to the resurrection of Jesus and his role as saviour and king. The Jewish authorities cause trouble.
1.	What did Peter accuse Ananias and Sapphira of doing in their hearts?
2.	What was the response of Peter and the apostles to the high priest ordering them to stop preaching?
3.	What punishment did the apostles receive this time?



Day 7

Acts 6	
	The Hellenist (Greek) believers complain about the treatment of Hellenist widows. Seven believers are chosen to address the problem. One of them, Stephen, is the first recorded believer to die. Stephen shows how Israel as a nation has always rejected God. They have now also rejected his Son.
1.	What was the complaint about and what did the twelve do about it?
2.	What effect did the spread of the word of God have in Jerusalem?
3.	What did the members of the synagogues do when they could not answer Stephen?
