Acts 7	
	Stephen annoys the Jews by summarising their rebellious history. He shows how Israel as a nation had always rejected God. They have now rejected his son. They then stone Stephen to death. Saul of Tarsus is involved in the execution.
1.	What did God tell Abraham about the future of his offspring?
2.	How did God help Joseph when he was sold into Egypt?
3.	What did the people say to Aaron when they thought that Moses had abandoned them?

Day 2

Acts 8	
	Persecution makes the believers scatter and they take the message wherever they go. They preach the things concerning the Kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ.
1.	What was the result of Saul's persecution of the assembly in Jerusalem?
2.	What did Simon think he could buy from Peter and John?
3.	What did the eunuch want to do after Philip explained about Jesus?

Day 3

Acts 9	
	Saul, one of the ringleaders of the persecution, is brought to the ground by a light and voice from heaven. He then becomes a believer and is baptised.
1.	Who spoke to Saul out of the bright light?
2.	Why was Ananias reluctant to visit Saul of Tarsus?
3.	What did the Jews want to do when Saul started talking to people about Jesus?

Day 4

Acts 10	
	The Roman centurion Cornelius is told in a vision to send for Peter to hear his message. Even a good living man like Cornelius has to learn what he must believe and then be baptised.
1.	What does the record tell us about the character of Cornelius?
2.	What is Peter's conclusion after Cornelius tells him why he sent for him?
3.	What finally convinced Peter that he should baptise these Gentiles?



Day 5

Acts 11	
	Peter tells the early church about the conversion of Cornelius - a non-Jew. Non-Jews are then accepted into the early church. Notice the first occurrence of the word Christians.
1.	What was the reaction of those who initially contended with Peter, when they heard his story?
2.	Where were the disciples first called Christians?
3.	What was the reaction of the church in Antioch when they heard of the famine in Judea?

Day 6

Acts 12	
	After the apostle James is killed, the apostle Peter is arrested. Peter then miraculously escapes. The disciples had prayed for his release from prison. But they are surprised when their prayers are answered.
1.	What did Herod do in an attempt to oppress the early believers?
2.	Whose house did Peter go to when he was released from prison, and what were they doing?
3.	What happened to the prison guards who had lost their prisoner?

Day 7

Acts 13	
	Saul (now called Paul), Barnabas and John Mark go off to preach. They go to Cyprus and Antioch in Pisidia. Paul tells his hearers that Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead. Sins can be forgiven through faith in Jesus Christ.
1.	Where did the apostles preach in Salamis?
2.	What was the effect on the proconsul of Elymas being blinded?
3.	What was the reaction of the Jews when the whole city of Antioch wanted to hear the word of God?
