# Summary Points

- v 1 to 6 Paul encourages the believers to hold onto the freedom from the law brought through being in Christ
- v 7 to 12 Paul is concerned that the influence of those who want to keep the law will spread through the congregations in Galatia
- v 13 to 15 Believers must use their freedom from law to love one another (see theme) rather than hurting each other by their selfishness
- v 16 to 18 There is a conflict going on in believers between their natural inclinations (the flesh) and what God would have them do (the spirit)
- v 19 to 26 Paul gives examples of works of the flesh to avoid and qualities of the spirit to develop

1 John 4 verses 7 and 11
