## Summary Points

- **v 1 to 5** Believers should gently restore anyone who has gone astray and be careful they don't become proud (see theme) or go astray themselves
- **v 6 to 10** If we follow our natural inclinations (sowing to the flesh) we will have no hope. If we sow to the spirit we will have eternal life. As opportunity arises do good to all
- **v 11 to 18** A final appeal to trust in what Jesus Christ achieved on the cross and to resist returning to the law of Moses

*Malachi 4 verse 1*

The apostle Peter warns that pride is a bad trait:

*1 Peter 5 verses 5 and 6*
