Summary Points

- v 1 to 16 Jesus tells a parable about labourers in a vineyard. Those who work longest complain when they all receive the same amount of pay. The master reminds them that they have all received what they agreed to and he decides what he does with his own money
- v 17 to 19 Jesus foretells his suffering, death and resurrection (see theme)
- v 20 to 28 The other disciples are indignant when Zebedee's children ask Jesus for the best places in his Kingdom. Jesus tells them to follow his example and be servants if they really want to be great
- v 29 to 34 Coming out of Jericho, Jesus gives sight to two blind men who call him son of David (see theme)

The significance of Jesus' resurrection

A selection of verses showing the significance of Jesus Christ rising from the dead.

Jesus says that those who die, who believe in him, will live again:

John 11 verse 25

The apostle Paul tells us that if we are associated with Christ, we can be raised as he was:

Romans 6 verse 5

God has not only raised the Lord from the dead, he has power to raise us as well:

1 Corinthians 6 verse 14

He [God] who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise those who believe:

2 Corinthians 4 verse 14

The apostle Peter says that because Christ was raised we can have a real hope for the future:

1 Peter 1 verse 3
