Questions

- 1. What were the Israelites to remember about the day they left Egypt?
- 2. What were they to do in the special seven days?
- 3. How were the Israelites to know where they should go?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 10 All future generations are to remember their escape from Egypt, when they observe the feast of unleavened bread (see information)
- v 11 to 16 They are to teach their children that the Israelite firstborn are set apart to the Lord because they were not killed with the Egyptian firstborn. All firstborn animals are to be sacrificed and firstborn sons are to be redeemed
- **v 17 to 22** By a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night, God leads the Israelites into the wilderness. Moses takes Joseph's bones with him

Timeline 1500 BC

Information

Feast of unleavened bread

Instructions about the feast of unleavened bread are given as the Israelites are preparing to leave the slavery in Egypt.

The feast is to be a memorial of their escape from Egypt:

Exodus 12 verses 17 to 20

When the law is given to Moses, the feast of unleavened bread is included:

Exodus 23 verses 14 and 15

The book of Leviticus, which gives details of all aspects of the Israelites' worship, also gives instructions about the feast of unleavened bread:

Leviticus 23 verses 4 to 8

As they are about to go into the promised land, the Israelites are reminded to keep the feast of unleavened bread:

Numbers 28 verses 16 and 17
