? Questions

- 1. What does the LORD say that he will do to Pharaoh and what will be the result?
- 2. What had the people said to Moses when they were in Egypt?
- 3. What was the effect on the people when they saw their deliverance?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 9 The LORD hardens Pharaoh's heart and he pursues the children of Israel into the wilderness. Pharaoh and his army catch up with the Israelites at the sea (see map)
- v 10 to 14 The Israelites are frightened, but Moses tells them that God will save them
- v 15 to 29 The LORD divides the sea before them and they walk through on dry land, but the Egyptians are drowned when they attempt to follow
- v 30 and 31 After seeing the effects of God's power (see theme), the Israelites believe in the Lord and in his servant Moses

Theme / Information

The power and permanence of God

A selection of verses showing that God is all-powerful and never changes.

King David tells the Israelites of God's greatness:

1 Chronicles 29 verses 10 and 11 The psalmist makes it clear that God has great power: Psalms 147 verses 4 to 8 The prophet Jeremiah echoes the same thoughts: Jeremiah 51 verses 15 and 16 God uses his power to bring about our salvation: 1 Peter 1 verses 3 and 4 The apostle James reminds us that God doesn't change: James 1 verse 17
