Introduction

Paul encourages believers to co-operate together and gives them a list of good attitudes to cultivate.

Summary Points

- v 1 to 3 Euodia and Syntyche are encouraged to settle their differences
- v 4 to 7 Paul encourages the believers to rejoice in what Christ has done, and to trust in God
- v 8 and 9 Meditating on good and profitable things taught by Paul will bring God's peace
- v 10 to 13 Paul thanks the Philippians for their concern for him, but he has learnt to be content (see theme) whatever happens
- v 14 to 18 He thanks the Philippians for their past help. Paul reassures them about his welfare and of his care of them
- v 19 to 23 He assures them that God will supply their needs for their lives in Christ
