Moses reminds the Israelites of the importance of keeping God's commands and trusting in him.



Questions

1. What did God say would happen if they heard and observed his commandments?
2. Why did Moses say the people shouldn't go after other gods?
3. What were the Israelites to tell their sons when they asked what the LORD's commandments were all about?



Summary Points

- **v 1 to 9** Moses tells Israel to live according to God's laws. They are to love the one God (see theme). They are to teach their children his commands and remember them at all times
- **v 10 to 19** Moses warns them about the ease of forgetting God when all is going well. They are not to worship the gods of the surrounding nations
- **v 20 to 25** Moses says that they should remind their children of what God has done for them, and will do if they obey him

Theme

The only true God

A selection of verses showing that the God of the Bible is the only true God.

Through the prophet Isaiah, God challenges the idols to foretell the future as he does:

Isaiah 41 verses 21 to 24

Later in Isaiah's prophecy, God reminds him that he can foretell the future:

Isaiah 42 verse 9

God says that the fact that he has foretold the Jews' history is evidence that he is God:

Isaiah 43 verses 9 to 12, 45 verses 20 to 22

Jesus says that our long-term future depends on us knowing the only true God:

John 17 verse 3

The apostle Paul tells the Corinthians that there is one God and one Lord Jesus Christ:

1 Corinthians 8 verse 6
