# Questions

- 1. Who did Joshua say were their fathers and what does he say about them?
- 2. Which nations did God enable them to defeat so they could possess the land?
- 3. How many times, in this chapter, did the Israelites say that they would serve the LORD?



# **Summary Points**

- v 1 to 13 Joshua reminds the people of what God has done for them since the time of Abraham. He mentions all the nations they have been able to overcome (see first map)
- v 14 and 15 Joshua encourages the people to serve the God of Israel (see theme) and put away the local gods
- v 16 to 28 At Shechem (see second map), Joshua makes a covenant with the people, writes in the book of the law of God and sets up a stone as a witness
- v 29 to 33 Joshua and Eleazar die, and the people bury Joseph's bones which have been brought from Egypt

#### God is the God of Israel

A selection of verses showing that the God of the Bible is also the God of Israel.

Moses told Pharoah that the LORD wanted his people released:

Exodus 5 verse 1

God chose Israel as a special nation through whom he could work:

Deuteronomy 7 verses 6 - 8

Israel's leader, Joshua, reminded the people of their responsibility to their God:

Joshua 24 verse 23

Hezekiah could call on the God of Israel to rescue his people in their time of trouble:

*Isaiah 37 verses 15 - 17* 

The people recognised the hand of God when Jesus healed:

Matthew 15 verse 31
