Summary Points

- v 1 to 3 Beware of hypocrisy (see theme), nothing can be hidden from God
- v 4 to 12 Fear God not men
- v 13 to 15 Jesus did not come to be a judge but warns against covetousness
- v 16 to 21 Parable of a rich man who dies before he can enjoy his riches
- v 22 to 34 Jesus encourages trust in God's provision of daily necessities, and encourages focus on seeking God's Kingdom
- v 35 to 59 Parables about being ready for Christ's coming and the Kingdom

A selection of verses illustrating that we should not be two-faced.

The prophet Ezekiel talks about insincere people, who say pleasant things, but really are selfish hypocrites:

Ezekiel 33 verse 31

The psalmist says some people flatter and lie:

Psalm 78 verses 36 and 37

Jesus speaks about the hypocritical scribes and Pharisees in very unflattering terms:

Matthew 23 verse 27

Mark 7 verses 6 to 8

Luke 11 verse 39

The apostle John says that our love for our fellows is to be shown in deeds not just in words:

1 John 3 verse 18
