

Introduction

After a sham trial, Jesus is crucified, dies and is buried.



- 1. The crowd, that had a few days before shouted Hosanna, now shouted crucify him. Who had changed their minds?
- 2. How long was Jesus on the cross before he died?
- 3. What happened when Jesus took his last breath?



The traditional location of Golgotha, where Jesus was crucified (v 22).



Summary Points

- **v 1 to 5** The Jewish council deliver Jesus to Pilate (the Roman governor) who is amazed that Jesus does not defend himself
- **v 6 to 15** The crowd turn down Pilate's offer to release Jesus. Despite his own reservations, Pilate delivers Jesus to be crucified, in order to satisfy the crowd
- v 16 to 41 Jesus is crucified as predicted by the prophets (see theme). He dies on the cross. The reactions of some of the people who witness it are recorded
- **v 42 to 47** Jesus is taken from the cross and put in a tomb by Joseph of Arimathaea, a member of the Jewish council. Some of the women watch where Jesus is buried

Jesus' crucifixion fulfilled Old Testament predictions

A selection of Old Testament predictions that Jesus fulfilled in his crucifixion.

The Old Testament repeatedly foretells various aspects of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ:

Psalm 22 v 16 to 18 predicts Matthew 27 v 35

Psalm 69 v 21 predicts Matthew 27 v 48

Psalm 22 v 8 predicts Matthew 27 v 41 to 43

Isaiah 53 v 9 predicts Matthew 27 v 57 to 60
