- 1. What are we told about Elimelech and why he did what he did?
- 2. What did Naomi tell her daughters-in-law to do when she decided to return to Israel?
- 3. Ruth objected when Naomi told her to return. What five things did Ruth say she wanted to share with Naomi?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 3 Because of a famine in Israel, Elimelech goes to Moab (see map) with his wife Naomi and his two sons, and he dies there
- v 4 and 5 Naomi's sons marry Orpah and Ruth, then after about 10 years both sons
- v 6 to 15 When the famine ends, Naomi decides to go home, telling Orpah and Ruth to stay in Moab
- v 16 to 22 Ruth, wanting to worship the God of Israel (see theme), insists on returning with Naomi. They reach Bethlehem at harvest time

The people recognised the hand of God when Jesus healed:


