Questions

1. How many times does Pilate say Jesus is not guilty?
2. What is Herod hoping to see when Jesus is brought before him?
3. What does Jesus ask his Father to do in relation to those who are about to crucify him?



Summary Points

- **v 1 to 25** Jesus is brought before the Roman governor Pilate, and also Herod. Despite there being no evidence against Jesus, Pilate condemns him to death by crucifixion
- **v 26 to 43** Jesus is led away to be crucified. As he hangs on the cross he is mocked by those watching. One of the two criminals crucified with him acknowledges Jesus' innocence. He recognises that Jesus is the coming King (see theme) and asks to be remembered by him when he comes in his Kingdom
- **v 44 to 56** Jesus dies at about 3 pm and is hurriedly buried by Joseph of Arimathaea before the evening which is the start of the Sabbath

A selection of verses showing that Jesus is both Saviour and King.

Before his birth, Mary his mother is told Jesus has a great role in God's plan:

Luke 1 verses 30 to 33

An angel tells the shepherds about the important role God has for him:

Luke 2 verses 10 and 11

A Samaritan woman recognises who Jesus is:

John 4 verse 42

The apostle Peter accuses the Jews of killing Jesus and then tells them of his place in God's plan:

Acts 5 verses 29 to 32

John, in the book of Revelation, talks about Jesus as both our King and Saviour:

Revelation 1 verses 4 to 6
