The first book of Samuel starts at the end of the period of the judges.



- 1. What did Hannah vow to do?
- 2. What did Hannah call her son?
- 3. What did Hannah tell Eli when she brought Samuel to him?



Summary Points

- v 1 and 2 Elkanah has two wives, Peninnah, who has children and Hannah who has none
- **v 3 to 8** Each year, when they go to Shiloh (see map) to worship, Elkanah gives Hannah a double portion, but her rival Penninah provokes her because she has no children
- v 9 to 18 In her distress Hannah prays for a son and promises to give him back to the LORD
- v 19 to 28 God hears her prayer (see theme) and when her son is weaned, she brings him to Eli the priest and leaves him there to help in the temple service

Several Psalms tell us that God will hear our prayers:

Psalm 65 verse 2, 86 verse 7

Through the prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah, God says he hears prayer:

Isaiah 65 verse 24

Jeremiah 29 verses 12 and 13

Jesus tells us that requests are only responded to if his words remain in us:

John 15 verse 7

God hears the prayer of Cornelius:

Acts 10 verse 31


The apostle John tells us that God responds to requests that are according to his will:

Israel in the time of the kings


Map showing some places mentioned in the time of the kings of Israel including Shiloh. A question mark after a place name indicates that the exact location is not certain:
