Summary Points

- v 1 to 9 One night Samuel hears God calling him. Eventually Eli realises who is calling and tells him to say that he is listening
- v 10 to 14 God tells Samuel all that he will do to judge the house of Eli because of his sons' wickedness and his lack of control over them
- v 15 to 21 Eli makes Samuel tell him all that God said, and accepts what God is about to do (see theme)

A selection of verses showing we should accept God's will in our lives:

Eli the priest was prepared to accept the message God gave to the child Samuel:

1 Samuel 3 verses 16 to 18

Job accepted the trouble that God sent in his life:

Job 1 verse 21
```

The Lord Jesus Christ is the best example of submitting to what God wants despite not wanting to do so:

Mark 14 verses 35 and 36

The letter to the Hebrews encourages us to accept the discipline that God sends because it is for our good:

Hebrews 12 verse 9


We should realise that sometimes our plans may not happen if they are not according to God's will:
