Summary Points

- v 1 and 2 Paul encourages Timothy to preach the word, as there will be a judgement (see theme) at the second coming of Jesus
- v 3 to 5 Paul warns that, before this, people will ignore true doctrine, preferring to settle for what sounds good to them
- v 6 to 8 As Paul faces death, he is confident that he will be given the crown of riahteousness
- v 9 to 15 Several friends have left Paul. He asks Timothy to come and bring Mark with him together with warm clothing and his books
- v 16 to 22 Paul had little human support at his trial, but felt the Lord's presence and looks forward in faith to the Kingdom

How should we view the judgement?

A selection of verses showing what the Bible tells us about our judgement:

The apostle Paul makes it clear that there will be a judgement:

2 Corinthians 5 verse 10

The apostle John tells us that if we confess our sins we will be forgiven:

1 John 1 verse 9

This means that we can be blameless at that time if all of our sins have been confessed and forgiven:

1 Corinthians 1 verse 8

The apostle Paul tells us that we will not be condemned if we are in Christ Jesus:

Romans 8 verse 1

Jesus Christ tells us that how we are judged by him will be influenced by how we have judged others:

Luke 6 verse 37 Matthew 7 verse 2 James 2 verse 13
