## Questions

1. How does David suggest that they can overcome the Jebusites in Jerusalem?
2. Why does David become a great king?
3. What signal does God give David, to show him when he should attack the Philistines the second time?



## Summary Points

- **v 1 to 3** David is anointed king over all Israel at Hebron (see map)
- **v 4 to 8** David takes the stronghold of Zion (part of Jerusalem – see map) from the Jebusites who think their city is impregnable
- **v 9 to 16** David establishes himself in Jerusalem and the LORD is with him. He takes more wives and has more sons
- **v 17 to 25** David defeats the Philistines twice after asking God's advice (see theme)

## Theme / Information

### God is with his people

*A selection of verses showing that God promises always to be with his people.*

God promises to be with Abraham's son [Isaac] and his grandson [Jacob]:

*Genesis 26 verse 3, 28 verse 15*

God says he will be with Joshua as he was with Moses:

*Joshua 1 verse 5*

God says he was with David wherever he went. He has destroyed his enemies and made him great:

*2 Samuel 7 verses 8 and 9*

David asks that God will be with his son Solomon in building the temple:

*1 Chronicles 22 verse 11*

Jesus Christ promises that he and God will be with those who love him:

*John 14 verse 23*

Paul ends his letter to the Romans by asking that God may be with the early believers:

*Romans 15 verse 33*
