Summary Points

- **v 1 to 6** Moses and Jesus are described as faithful in their houses. Faithful believers are part of Christ's house
- **v 7 to 19** The history of Israel's failure to believe God's promises, is given as a warning to hold firm to the end and not to lose faith

Theme

God wants us to believe he will do what he has promised

A selection of verses showing that God asks us to have faith in him.

The letter to the Hebrews spells out clearly that faith in God is essential:

Hebrews 11 verse 6

God gave miraculous signs to Moses as evidence to encourage the Israelites to believe what God said:

Exodus 4 verses 6 to 8

The psalmists repeatedly criticised the Israelites for not believing God's promise of help despite having evidence of his help in the past:

Psalms 78 verses 11 and 12, 106 verses 21 to 24

God told the prophet Isaiah that Israel was a witness to encourage belief in him. He tells Israel:

Isaiah 43 verse 10

The Evidence - You decide website (theevidence.org.uk) looks at the evidence about the Jews which encourages trust in what God has said.

Jesus said that God was working through him. The miracles (works) that he could do, give us confidence to trust what he said:

John 10 verses 37 and 38

Paul told the Roman believers how to develop faith:

Romans 10 verse 17
