Summary Points

- v 1 to 4 High priests are selected by God
- v 5 and 6 Jesus' priesthood is following the pattern of an earlier priest (who was a contemporary of Abraham)
- v 7 to 10 Jesus learned obedience and was made perfect through his suffering (see theme). We too must also be obedient to his teaching to be saved
- v 11 to 14 The Hebrews are accused of having poor spiritual development

Theme

Jesus was made perfect through suffering

A selection of verses showing that Jesus had to suffer and as a result was made perfect.

Jesus told his followers that he was to suffer a cruel death:

Mark 8 verse 31

The apostle Peter told his hearers that the Old Testament prophets foretold Christ's sufferings:

1 Peter 1 verses 10 and 11

The prophet Isaiah gave a graphic description of these sufferings:

Isaiah 53 verses 4 to 8

The letter to the Hebrews tells us that Jesus learned the real meaning of obedience by submitting to severe suffering in order to do God's will:

Hebrews 2 verses 9 and 10, 5 verses 7 to 9
