Summary Points

- v 1 to 3 Faith (see theme) is having confidence in things we can't see
- v 4 to 12 Acts of faith include Noah preparing for the flood by building a ship and Abraham going to an unknown destination
- v 13 to 16 These faithful people did not receive the promises but used their lives to prepare for a better life
- v 17 to 31 Because of his faith, Abraham was prepared to offer Isaac as a sacrifice. Examples of faith in the lives of Abraham's descendants, Moses and others
- v 32 to 40 Many suffered terrible treatment, yet held fast to their faith in God's promise

Belief and faith

A selection of verses showing that God wants us to believe that he will do what he has promised.

The letter to the Hebrews makes it clear that God regards faith in him as vital:

Hebrews 11 verse 6

This faith comes from reading and thinking about God's message to us:

Romans 10 verse 17

Abraham is a good example of faith in action. He believes God can do what he says when he promises that Abraham's ageing wife will have a baby:

Romans 4 verses 19 to 22

We are justified (made right with God) by believing in Jesus Christ:

Galatians 2 verse 16

The apostle Paul tells us belief in the Scriptures leads us to salvation through faith in **Christ Jesus:**

2 Timothy 3 verse 15
