- **v 17 to 25** Final instructions and a blessing from the God of peace who raised Jesus from the dead

*A selection of verses showing what a believer's attitude in life should be.*

King David writes that a good man with little wealth is better off than the unscrupulous rich:

*Psalms 37 verse 16*

David's son Solomon says very much the same:

*Proverbs 16 verse 8*

*Ecclesiastes 4 verse 6*

Jesus himself says that we should not be anxious as God will provide all our needs:

*Matthew 6 verses 25 and 26*

The apostle Paul writes that the combination of contentment and godliness is a tremendous asset:

*1 Timothy 6 verses 6 to 10*
