*This Psalm of David expresses confidence in God, both then and for the future.*

1. Why does David ask God to preserve him?
2. What does David say to the LORD?
3. Why is David confident he will not be moved?



## Summary Points

- **v 1 to 4** David is putting his trust in God and resisting worship of false gods
- **v 5 to 7** He believes that God has promised him a bright future and thanks God for this hope
- **v 8 to 11** Because of his confidence in God's promise, nothing will stand in his way. These verses are quoted in the New Testament (Acts 2 v 25 to 27) as pointing forward to the resurrection of Jesus Christ (see theme) (Acts 2 v 30 and 31)

## Theme

### The significance of Jesus' resurrection

*A selection of verses showing the significance of Jesus Christ rising from the dead.*

Jesus says that those who die, who believe in him, will live again:

*John 11 verse 25*

The apostle Paul tells us that if we are associated with Christ, we can be raised as he was:

*Romans 6 verse 5*

God has not only raised the Lord from the dead, he has power to raise us as well:

*1 Corinthians 6 verse 14*

He [God] who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise those who believe:

*2 Corinthians 4 verse 14*

The apostle Peter says that because Christ was raised we can have a real hope for the future:

*1 Peter 1 verse 3*
