This Psalm of David expresses confidence in God, both then and for the future.

Questions

- 1. Why does David ask God to preserve him?
- 2. What does David say to the LORD?
- 3. Why is David confident he will not be moved?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 4 David is putting his trust in God and resisting worship of false gods
- v 5 to 7 He believes that God has promised him a bright future and thanks God for this hope
- v 8 to 11 Because of his confidence in God's promise, nothing will stand in his way. These verses are quoted in the New Testament (Acts 2 v 25 to 27) as pointing forward to the resurrection of Jesus Christ (see theme) (Acts 2 v 30 and 31)

Theme

The significance of Jesus' resurrection

A selection of verses showing the significance of Jesus Christ rising from the dead.

Jesus says that those who die, who believe in him, will live again:

John 11 verse 25

The apostle Paul tells us that if we are associated with Christ, we can be raised as he was:

Romans 6 verse 5

God has not only raised the Lord from the dead, he has power to raise us as well:

1 Corinthians 6 verse 14

He [God] who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise those who believe:

2 Corinthians 4 verse 14

The apostle Peter says that because Christ was raised we can have a real hope for the future:

1 Peter 1 verse 3
