



Introduction

The Psalm is about a king and his bride (see theme). Verses 6 and 7 are quoted in Hebrews 1 v 8 and 9 and applied to Jesus.

Questions

- 1. Why has God blessed this king?
- 2. Why has God anointed this king with the oil of gladness?
- 3. What will the psalmist do for the name of this king and what will be the result?

Summary Points

- v 1 and 2 The psalmist feels he must praise the king
- v 3 to 5 The king is encouraged to maintain truth and righteousness when he deals with his enemies
- v 6 to 9 God has anointed this king because he reflects God's principles
- v 10 to 12 A daughter is encouraged to leave her own family and honour the king.
 Gifts are brought
- v 13 to 15 The princess and her companions will be brought to the king with great joy
- v 16 and 17 Sons will be made princes and the king's name will be remembered with thankfulness

Theme

God's people are described as a bride

A selection of verses showing that God refers to his people as a bride:

God made a covenant with the nation of Israel like the covenant between a bridegroom and a bride:

Ezekiel 16 verse 8

Isaiah 54 verse 5

Jesus refers to himself as the bridegroom:

Matthew 9 verse 15

Using the same analogy John the Baptist says:

John 3 verse 29

The apostle Paul also describes believers as the bride of Jesus Christ:

2 Corinthians 11 verse 2

The book of Revelation also uses the symbol of Christ finally being united with faithful believers as his bride

Revelation 19 verse 7 and 9
