## Summary Points

- **v 1 to 5** David acknowledges Jerusalem as the centre of rulership (see theme) and worship
- **v 6 to 9** A prayer for the time when Jerusalem is finally at peace

## Theme

### Jerusalem - future world capital

Psalm 2 says that Zion, as part of Jerusalem, is the centre of the rulership as promised by God:

*Psalm 2 verse 6*

Mount Zion is described as God's chosen city in Psalm 48:

*Psalm 48 verses 1 and 2*

The prophets Jeremiah and Micah speak of the world being ruled from Jerusalem at a time of peace:

*Jeremiah 3 verse 17*

*Micah 4 verses 1 to 3*

The prophet Zechariah tells of the sanctions that will be imposed on nations who don't respect the rule from Jerusalem:

*Zechariah 14 verses 16 to 19*

Jesus identifies Jerusalem as an important city:

*Matthew 5 verses 34 and 35*
