- 3. What does Isaiah say that God's servant will do for the nations?



# **Summary Points**

- **v 1 to 6** Jerusalem, whose inhabitants have recently been oppressed by the Assyrians, is encouraged to wake up and listen to the LORD's words
- **v 7 to 12** Good news of peace and salvation will be publicised. The inhabitants of Jerusalem are encouraged to rejoice in their salvation
- v 13 to 15 God's servant will be exalted and wise, but people will be astonished at his disfigured appearance
