Summary Points

- v 1 to 8 God's servant was rejected and suffered for our sins
- v 9 Although innocent he was killed and buried
- v 10 to 12 His sufferings and resurrection were part of God's plan for our salvation

Verse 1 is quoted in John 12 v 37 and 38 and Romans 10 v 16 Verse 4 is quoted in Matthew 8 v 16 and 17 Verses 7 and 8 are quoted in Acts 8 v 32 and 33 Verse 9 is quoted in 1 Peter 2 v 22 Verse 12 is quoted in Mark 15 v 27 and 28 and Luke 22 v 37

Allusions:

Verse 4 is alluded to in Hebrews 9 v 28 Verses 4, 5 and 6 are alluded to in 1 Peter 2 v 24 and 25 Verse 7 is alluded to in Matthew 26 v 62 and 63, 27 v 12 to 14, Mark 14 v 60 and 61, 15 v 5, Luke 23 v 9 and John 19 v 9 Verse 9 is alluded to in Matthew 27 v 57 to 60 and Luke 23 v 33

Verse 12 is alluded to in Matthew 27 v 38
