Summary Points

- v 1 to 9 The LORD loves his people Israel (see theme) and will bring them back to their land
- v 10 to 30 The LORD will gather his people from out of distant lands and they will be blessed in their own land
- v 31 to 34 Israel will come to know their LORD and his law and he will forgive them
- v 35 to 40 The LORD will not cast off Israel. Their existence is as sure as that of the sun, moon and stars. Jerusalem will become a holy city

Israel - God's chosen people

A selection of verses showing how this theme runs consistently through the Bible.

God makes it clear to the early Israelites that they are a chosen people:

Deuteronomy 14 verse 2

King Solomon, in his prayer at the dedication of the temple he has built, says this about the Israelites:

1 Kings 8 verse 53

God tells the prophet Isaiah that the Israelites are special to him:

Isaiah 44 verse 21

God gives a similar message to the prophet Jeremiah:

Jeremiah 46 verses 27 and 28

The apostle Paul confirms that the Israelites are still God's chosen people:

Romans 11 verses 1 and 2
