Summary Points

- v 1 to 13 The Chaldeans will capture Jerusalem and take the people captive. But eventually the people will return, the city will be rebuilt and there will be peace in the land
- v 14 to 18 A descendant of David (see theme) will then be their saviour, and they will then never be without a king and priests
- v 19 to 26 As sure as day follows night, God's promises to Israel will never be broken

Theme

God's promises to David

God promises king David that he will have a special descendant whose reign will not end:

2 Samuel 7 verses 12 and 13

The same promise is also recorded in the Chronicles record:

1 Chronicles 17 verses 11 to 14

The Psalms say that God has promised to give David a descendant who will be king:

Psalm 89 verses 3 and 4, 132 verse 11

In their preaching, the apostles Peter and Paul say that Jesus is the special descendant promised to David:

Acts 2 verses 29 and 30, 13 verses 22 and 23
