



Introduction

The prophet, Ezekiel, was taken to Babylon at the start of Zedekiah's reign, 11 years before Jerusalem finally fell to the Babylonians.

Questions

- 1. How does the LORD describe the children of Israel and their fathers?
- 2. What will the children of Israel know, whether or not they listen to Ezekiel?
- 3. What was in the scroll of a book that Ezekiel was given?

Summary Points

- v 1 to 5 The LORD gives a message for the rebellious children of Israel. Whether or not they will listen they will know that a prophet has been among them
- v 6 to 10 Ezekiel is told not to be afraid of the people's opposition (see theme) when he speaks to them about the LORD's warning message. Ezekiel is shown a scroll

A selection of verses showing that this theme runs consistently through the Bible.

The psalmist tells us that the righteous can expect problems from the wicked:

Psalm 37 verses 12 to 14

Psalm 71 verse 4

Jesus Christ tells us that his followers can expect to be unpopular:

John 15 verses 18 to 20

The apostle Paul says that followers of Jesus should expect persecution:

2 Timothy 3 verse 12

The apostle John says that this unpopularity should not be a surprise:

1 John 3 verse 13
