Questions

- 1. Why does the LORD say the house of Israel will not listen to Ezekiel?
- 2. What does the LORD say to Ezekiel about his responsibilities as a watchman to the wicked men?
- 3. What does the Lord GOD tell Ezekiel about his ability to talk?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 3 Ezekiel is told to eat a scroll and speak to the house of Israel
- v 4 to 15 Ezekiel is to speak God's words to the people in captivity. He is not speaking a foreign language but they will not hear. He then experiences the LORD's glory (see theme) and is transported to sit among the captives by the river Chebar for seven days
- v 16 to 21 The LORD tells Ezekiel that he has to warn the house of Israel to change their wicked ways
- v 22 to 27 Ezekiel is told that he is to be dumb unless he is actually speaking GOD's message

Theme

The glory of God

A selection of verses showing that God's glory includes both his creative and sustaining power and his character and purpose.

God's glory is seen in the splendour of the universe:

Psalm 19 verse 1

Psalm 97 verse 6

When Moses asks to see God's glory, he is told that he will see God's goodness and hear his name:

Exodus 33 verses 18 and 19

Moses is told that God's name and glory include his character:

Exodus 34 verses 5 to 7

Jesus Christ showed God's glory:

John 1 verse 14

Jesus prays that believers may be involved in God's glory:

John 17 verses 22 to 24

God's purpose is that the earth will eventually be full of the knowledge of his glory:

Habakkuk 2 verse 14
