Introduction

In symbolic language, John tells of his glimpse of the new city of Jerusalem.

Questions

- 1. What does the loud voice out of heaven say?
- 2. What does the one sitting on the throne say about those who are thirsty and those who overcome?
- 3. Why does the city have no need of the sun or moon?



Summary Points

- v 1 to 8 John sees a vision of a time when God dwells with his people. There is no more death (see theme). All evil will be removed from the world
- v 9 to 21 John then sees the Lamb's wife as a symbolic city, Jerusalem, made of all precious materials
- v 22 to 27 The Lord God and the Lamb dwell in the city which becomes a holy centre for all nations (see theme)

Themes

No more sin and death

A selection of verses showing that God has a plan to overcome the problem of death caused by sin.

The apostle Paul makes it clear to the Roman believers that we die because we sin:

Romans 5 verse 12

The apostle John says that we must acknowledge that we are sinners if we are to be forgiven:

1 John 1 verses 9 and 10

The apostle John tells us that God sent Jesus Christ to overcome the problem of death:

John 3 verse 16

The apostle Paul tells the Romans that we are reconciled to God through the death of His Son, Jesus Christ:

Romans 5 verse 10

The last book of the Bible tells us that eventually death will be no more:

Revelation 21 verses 3 and 4

Psalm 2 says that Zion, as part of Jerusalem, is the centre of the rulership as promised by God:

Psalm 2 verse 6

Psalm 48 verses 1 and 2

The prophets Jeremiah and Micah speak of the world being ruled from Jerusalem at a time of peace:

Jeremiah 3 verse 17

Micah 4 verses 1 to 3

The prophet Zechariah tells of the sanctions that will be imposed on nations who don't respect the rule from Jerusalem:

Zechariah 14 verses 16 to 19

Jesus identifies Jerusalem as an important city:

Matthew 5 verses 34 and 35
