Acts 22	
	The commander allows Paul to speak to the Jews. He tells them how he was a persecutor of Christians. He then tells them how his life changed on the road to Damascus. They turn on him and he is taken to the barracks. The next day he is taken before the Jewish leaders.
1.	How does Paul describe his early life?
2.	Ananias told Paul that God had appointed him to do something. What was it?
3.	What was it that Jesus said to him that so annoyed the Jews?

Day 2

Acts 23	
	Paul appears before the Jewish council. He divides them on the belief in resurrection causing a riot. The next day some Jews plot to kill him.
1.	How did Paul divide the council?
2.	Where did the Lord tell Paul he must go to testify?
3.	What were the proposed four recommendations that James made for the Gentiles?

Day 3

Acts 24	
	Paul is brought before the Roman governor Felix. Felix hears Paul's case, but won't make a decision. Paul remains a prisoner for two years till Felix is replaced by Festus.
1.	Paul summarises his way of life to Felix. What does he say?
2.	What was it that Paul thought the council had against him?
3.	What did Paul reason with Felix about?



Day 4

Acts 25	
	Paul appears before the new Roman governor Festus. Paul asks to be tried before Caesar. Festus agrees. Festus consults with King Agrippa over what charge to lay against Paul.
1.	Why did the high priest and the Jews want Paul to be taken to Jerusalem?
2.	What was Festus' compromise solution to the lack of evidence, and wanting to do the Jews a favour?
3.	Why did Festus ask Agrippa to hear the case against Paul?

Day 5

Acts 26	
	Paul appears before Festus, Agrippa and Bernice. Paul states his case to Festus and King Agrippa. They agree that Paul could have been released if he hadn't appealed to Caesar.
1.	What does Paul say he is being judged for?
2.	What were the reactions of Festus and Agrippa to Paul's speech?
3.	What was the verdict of Agrippa and Festus?

Day 6

Acts 27	
	Despite the shipwreck on the way to Rome, all escape safe to land.
1.	What was Paul's prediction about their proposed journey?
2.	What encouraged them to ignore Paul's warning?
3.	What was Paul's later prediction about their journey?

Day 7

Acts 28	
	Paul and his fellow-travellers stay on the Island of Malta for three months, before completing their journey to Rome. Paul finally arrives at Rome and preaches to all who will listen.
1.	Who came to meet Paul at The Market of Appius and The Three Taverns?
2.	Who did Paul say would listen to his message? Who didn't stay to listen to him?
3.	What did Paul spend two years doing in Rome?
